

How to Makeup Meetings Online

- Go to www.Rotary7670.org and click on Makeup On Line (this takes you to the eClub One web site)
- Click on the tutorial on the left, or listen to the helpful Rotarian who pops up on the screen, for instructions. Spend 30 minutes on the site reading articles or watching videos, all of which can be found at top under Makeup Programs (be sure to record the titles of the programs you read or watched – you'll need those later)
- When you have completed your 30 minutes, click on Request Makeup (also at top) and donate if so inclined (recommended amount is what you might normally pay for lunch at your club and simply helps to maintain the site)
- Click on Request Makeup Form button, answer questions on form, including the program titles
- Give them Leslie Middleton's email address: Iferrell@catawbacountync.gov . . . You're done!
- Another option: view a previous meeting video on the hickoryrotary.org website and inform Leslie.

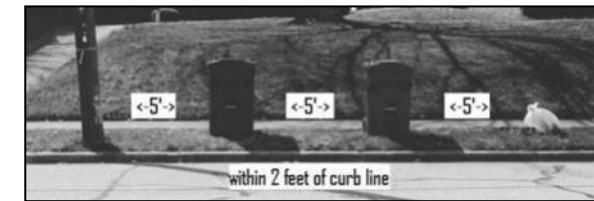

Recycling. Well crafted.

The new single stream recycling collection system uses a blue rollout cart that will be serviced by an automated truck. This means that one person will be operating the truck and no one will be riding on the back, making the process faster and safer. The new blue recycling roll-out carts provided by the City of Hickory are the same type of cart that you are used to using in the automated garbage pick up.



the carts will be collected by the automated truck. Garbage outside your rollout on a normal basis may require you to pay for an additional cart.

- If you regularly generate more household garbage and recycling than your roll-out carts will hold, call customer service at (828) 323-7500 to order an additional cart. Additional carts require payment of an additional solid waste fee (swf).

TO HELP SERVE YOU BETTER, REMEMBER TO:

- Please place all carts within 2 feet of the curb with the handle and wheels facing away from the street.
- Make sure the carts are at least 5 feet from trees, mailboxes, cars, other carts, yard waste, recyclables, or any other obstruction.

Before anyone in the Club gets completely "wiggled out," WIG #4 has been diligently working as we prepare for the transition to a new Rotary year of service to our community. Our WIG even has an international component with input from Michael Blackburn chiming in from Cape Town, South Africa, and Susan Huffman traveling to Bermuda last week.

From the WIG #4 (Serving Our Community) club survey of a few weeks ago, the team reviewed the responses received to help us determine our direction for the upcoming year in terms of identifying the Club's service focus and signature project. We received 53 surveys representing 69% of our average attendance. Of the surveys received, 29 indicated a strong preference for keeping "Education" as our primary service focus with "Early Childhood Education" as the area of emphasis. Additionally, another 17 surveys indicated a desire to focus on "Education" and moderately supported the emphasis on "Early Childhood Education." A quick assessment of our current charitable giving indicates that approximately 62% of our disbursements this year were made in the early childhood area of emphasis. While we received some excellent alternative suggestions and ideas, the WIG #4 team interpreted these results as a validation from a majority of our members for maintaining the focus of our Club.

Furthermore, the consensus of the WIG #4 team was to continue Rotarian Idol as the primary funding vehicle for our identified priorities, beginning with Imagination Library. The Rotarian Idol Committee has concurred while also emphasizing that new ways to involve more Club members in leadership and service in this signature project need to be found. Everyone agreed that including a "service" aspect to Rotarian Idol was a positive addition this year.

Following the suggestion of incoming President Mark Seaman, the WIG #4 team established a "short list" of "Serving Our Community" project areas for the Club.

Presently, the list suggested includes:

- International Project (aligning the project with our focus on education)
- Adopt-a School Project (expanding off of our project with Southwest Elementary to do a project in one new school per year)
- Establish an Interact Club at HCAM

While this "short list" is not definitive and certainly doesn't encompass all the projects to which the Club provides grants or opportunities for service, our WIG hopes this will give each of our members a better sense of how we propose to move forward this year in achieving our Rotary mission of "Service Above Self" to the Hickory community.

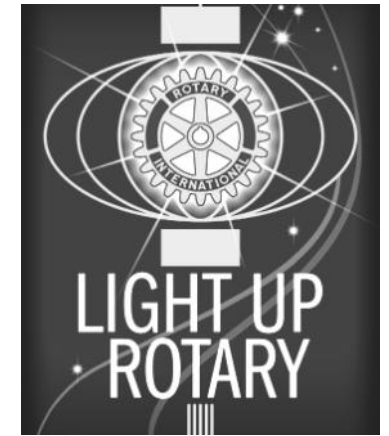
DG Gary Bray presented the club with a Presidential Citation to honor the club's achievements over the past year. Congratulations, us!!
