

How to Makeup Meetings Online

Mike Houston is entering his second year as Lenoir-Rhyne's Head Football Coach this fall.

In his first season at the helm in 2011, Houston led L-R to a 7-3 record (6-1 in the South Atlantic Conference) and guided the Bears to their first league championship since 1994. For his efforts, Houston was named the SAC Co-Coach Of The Year.



In addition, Houston remained in charge of the Bears' defense, which once again led the conference in total yards allowed (284.4 ypg), 10th-best in the nation.

Houston became the 18th Head Football Coach in Lenoir-Rhyne's history, when he was hired on May 9, 2011.

Before being elevated to head coach, Houston was the Bears' Defensive Coordinator and Secondary Coach for four seasons (2007-10). Under Houston's leadership, the Bears' defense had one of their best seasons in recent memory in 2010.

Two years ago, Lenoir-Rhyne led the South Atlantic Conference in total defense (276.6 ypg) and finished fourth in NCAA Division II in rushing defense (75.7 ypg). In addition, senior defensive back Marcus Shuford (Newton, N.C.) became the third player in school history to win league defensive player-of-the-year honors.

On February 4, 2010, Houston was elevated to Assistant Head Coach.

Houston came to Lenoir-Rhyne after spending one year (2006) as the Associate Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator at Brevard College.

At Brevard, Houston was part of a staff that re-established football after a 56-year absence. The 2006 Tornado squad won two games while playing a roster comprised of true freshmen.

Prior to Brevard, Houston served as the Head Coach at T.C. Roberson High School in Asheville, N.C., from 2001-05. Under Houston, T.C. Roberson went 42-18 (5-4 in the playoffs) and was a two-time Times-News Area Coach Of The Year (2002 and '04).

Houston was also named an Assistant Coach for the 2005 North Carolina Shrine Bowl staff and helped lead North Carolina to a 28-24 win over South Carolina.

Houston's 2004 T.C. Roberson squad was his best-ever, as the team went through the regular season undefeated and finished 13-1 before losing in the state

semifinals. The 2004 team averaged 38 points per game, while allowing just nine points per outing, as it won its first-ever conference championship in school history.

Houston left T.C. Roberson with the highest winning percentage of any coach in school history and helped establish the Rams as one of the top football programs in the state of North Carolina.

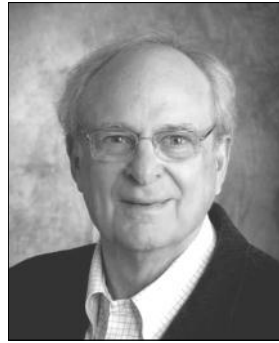
Houston, who was a 2005 Shrine Bowl Assistant Coach, spent five years as T.C. Roberson's Defensive Coordinator (1996-2000) before taking over the head job.

Houston started his coaching career at Forbush High School in East Bend, N.C., where he served as the Falcons' Defensive Coordinator (1994-95).

Houston is a 1994 graduate of Mars Hill College, with a bachelor's degree in biology and played tight end on the Lions' football squad.

Houston is married to the former Amanda Owen, and the couple has one child, Owen Michael, who was born on December 1, 2008.

Neill McGeachy is in charge of the program.

A recent issue of Our State Magazine featured an article by Lydialyle Gibson highlighting the incredible response of citizens in the Hickory area to a critical healthcare crisis which occurred in June, 1944—which many of you recall as the “Miracle of Hickory.” She reported that “the citizens of Hickory built a hospital in 54 hours to save their children from the worst polio outbreak that had ever hit the United States. Looking back now, even knowing the results—13 wards erected, doctors and nurses flocking in by the dozens, hundreds of patients treated and released—the enormity of the undertaking still bewilders.”

Historically, this occurred at the height of a war that had sent many of the region’s men into battle and its women into the nursing corps. But the need in Hickory was critical. The hospital at Hickory and North Carolina’s widening emergency drew medical specialists and polio experts from around the country. Doctors arrived from Yale University, Johns Hopkins University, and the Harvard Infantile Paralysis Commission Clinic.

Once again, the Hickory area is center stage in the health care industry as CVCC is now home to the largest simulated hospital east of the Mississippi—drawing nationwide attention. Physicians from Duke, Johns Hopkins and other major hospitals across the country are looking carefully at this innovation

in simulation as a forerunner of the most innovative health care education.

Gov. Bev Perdue and other state officials were present for the grand opening of the 28,000 square foot facility in September 2011. On the tour, participants were able to see a labor and delivery simulator, where students coached a mannequin in giving birth. They watched as a emergency responder students wheeled in mock victims of an accident, saw the life-like mannequins exhibit pre-programmed health issues and the students medically treating them as if they were real patients.

The simulated hospital features 11 acute patient care beds with a simulated nursing unit command center, three intensive care/trauma units, two bariatric units/ labor and delivery units, respiratory therapy, electro-neurodiagnostic and polysomnography units. All of these provide a setting to replicate medical phenomena that may occur in real-life clinical situations. In a three-year span, the Simulated Hospital makes it possible to train 250 nurses, train 90 additional certified nursing assistants, and offers a training site for hospital personnel from all over the eastern United States.

This multi-million dollar project, over five years in the making, is, according to CVCC President Garrett Hinshaw, “a national landmark in healthcare education.”

Once again, the Hickory area triumphs in leadership and innovation.

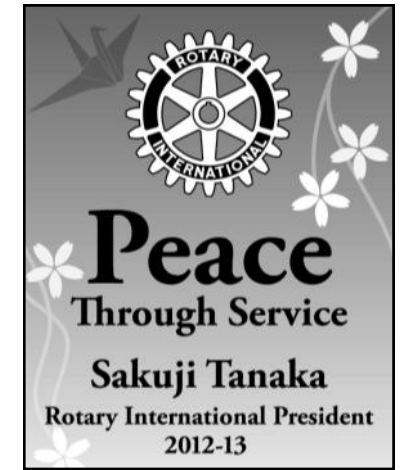
Last week . . .
