recently attended a conference in Seattle, Washington. Unlike the Carolinas this week, the weather was perfectly sunny and warm, signaling that fall had arrived. And so it made the streets of Seattle full of shoppers, commuters and panhandlers—all of whom are people just trying to get from point A to point B (metaphorically-speaking) in their lives and also literally sharing the same pavement each day.

Two experiences continue to linger in my mind and provide the story here that speaks to the Four-Way Test. After getting dressed up for a reception and realizing that the ticket I needed was still at the registration desk in the Washington State Convention Center, I decide to wander from the hotel to the center about a block away. It was after business hours but only about 6:30 p.m., and the activity in the building had come to a halt. Replacing it was a number of, mostly, men with all of their belongings, including sleeping bags, wandering the halls of the convention center to claim their spot for the night behind a planter or on a bench outside a meeting room.

My first reaction was surprise to think that this was an option for them. Why is this allowed? My second reaction was some degree of nervousness since I was not finding anyone from the conference as I walked several levels of the building. I did eventually see a police officer patrolling the building, and I relaxed a bit, but I never found my ticket and never made it to the reception.

You see, I needed a ticket to enter my event and was shut out otherwise, but these folks could enter without a ticket and raise their quality of life tremendously for the evening. Safe places matter. I had a safe place to return to and sleep at the hotel. And this convention center provided a beneficial, safe place.

The second experience was the panhandling woman outside of the drug store who claimed over and over to anyone who would listen that she was a grandmother of three just trying to make it and would someone help. When I didn't put money in her box, she still said a blessing for my day. I am disappointed in my response. I would like a do-over or some advice on how to handle next time. Why should my bell ringing efforts at Christmas be received with any more enthusiasm than what I gave to her? I did struggle to know if her story was the truth. But I also know that doing nothing is not fair to all concerned. It was comforting to know that the State of Washington was managing as best they could the number of homeless who needed that space as shelter at night.

It seems that good will was displayed there. Now I need to work on my good


